Pupil Progress

Congratulations to the staff on the fantastic Yr6 SATS results.
Outcome of assessment for 2018/19 along with commentary have been shared with all governors in the SEF.

Progress in both classrooms was broadly in line with expectations from last meeting apart from one child in Yr2 who underperformed.

EYFS update: An informal meeting was held between SP and LL regarding action points from the previous meeting. LL is satisfied that all points were addressed. See appendix for minutes from that meeting.

DP has noted the need for differentiation for the Yr3 pupils especially in writing (evidence in books).

Our predictions for 2019/20 have been shared.

Pupil premium child in Yr2 and Yr6 who both achieved end of year expected outcomes as predicted.

SEND

New IEP targets have been set for child 12 who is repeating year 2. Child seems happy to continue in class 2 and parents also onboard.

Old IEP targets were reviewed for all children in school during recent meeting with SENCO and new targets have been set. 6 IEP meetings will be held with staff this year to review, reset and monitor progress of children.

Safeguarding and Online safety

Safeguarding staff meeting is scheduled next week to discuss outcome of audit and check understanding of new KSIE 2019.
