Dear Parents

We've reached the last Friday of the year in Crosby Ravensworth School and we can reflect on a rollercoaster of a year. I'd like to start this bulletin by thanking everyone for their patience and understanding over the past week in particular. The school remains in 'outbreak' mode, but by helping us to follow the advice of Public Health Cumbria, you've all improved the odds of a healthy, non-quarantined, Christmas for the school and its surrounding community.

Commenting on the general situation for the county at present, the director of Public Health, Colin Cox, has commented:

"Thankfully cases are continuing to fall this week which is encouraging. However, with confirmation the Omicron variant has been detected in the UK, we must remain cautious until we learn more about it. The government has introduced new precautionary measures until that happens and I urge everyone to follow the guidance as closely as they can. This means wearing face coverings in shops and on public transport, self-isolating for 10 days if you've been in contact with someone infected with the Omicron variant and taking a PCR test if you've been abroad before day 2 following your return the UK. COVID booster vaccines are also set to be rolled out for anyone aged 18+ over the coming weeks in response to Omicron, but for now if you're aged 40 and over, book your booster vaccine as soon as you can."
