Friday Bulletin 22nd April

Dear Parents

I hope you have all had chance for some relaxation and family time over the Easter break. As you will be aware, on 1st April, the government issued updated Covid guidance. Below are some key points from the guidance (<https://www.gov.uk/guidance/people-with-symptoms-of-a-respiratory-infection-including-covid-19>) and a summary:

Children and young people with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend their education setting. Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people, where they can. They can go back to school, college or childcare, and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough to attend. It is not recommended that children and young people are tested for COVID-19 unless directed to by a health professional. If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test, if they can. After 3 days, if they feel well and do not have a high temperature, the risk of passing the infection on to others is much lower. This is because children and young people tend to be infectious to other people for less time than adults. Children and young people who usually go to school, college or childcare and who live with someone who has a positive COVID-19 test result should continue to attend as normal.

Please note that the statutory requirement for schools to provide work at home for pupils isolating has now been withdrawn. We know that Covid has not gone away and it is inevitable that transmission of viruses will occur in busy and densely occupied buildings like schools. We will continue to ventilate classrooms and encourage pupils to sanitise and wash their hands regularly. In common with many other local schools, we had staff absent last term with Covid, most of whom felt quite poorly for a number of days. Government guidance for adults who test positive is that they should isolate for 5 days and anyone who feels unwell should stay at home.

We hope that the new guidance provides another step along the return to 'normality'. In order to keep school running as smoothly as possible, we would politely ask you to keep the above in mind when assessing if your child is well enough to be in school.
