School funding crisis

Please see the following information from the Headteachers' Union regarding the response to school funding crisis. This certainly confirms the picture I painted at the first of our 'Future of School' meetings in November. I very much urge parents to respond by writing to their MP to protest against school funding levels as per Graham's closing comments.

Dear Colleagues,

Thank you to all who provided invaluable comments on school funding which I was able to convey (anonymised) to Nick Gibb [minister for Education], Tim Farron, Rory Stewart, Sue Hayman and John Woodcock, yesterday.

Nick Gibb gave no ground. As stated by Tim Farron in today's News and Star, Nick Gibb did not deny that schools in Cumbria face a £23 million cut in funding by 2020. The cuts to school funding are very real. All schools and academies not already affected soon will be, unless the government changes tack. For all the announcements containing spin about there being lots of money in Education (which they are able to say due to population growth), it is clear that the government is currently expecting schools to weather funding cuts like other sections of the public sector.

Key points I made during the meeting included:

- current staffing levels in schools reflects the move from meeting SEND in special schools to inclusion in mainstream settings, but that funding cuts threaten to undermine this (note - I also praised the work of Cumbria's special schools).
- secondary schools are already cutting whole subjects from their curriculum offer, with the arts and vocational subjects particularly threatened (a concern emphasised by Sue Hayman MP).

Cumbria is not alone in this. Nationally and regionally, union officials will continue to challenge the government to fund schools appropriately, but I believe that only a tidal wave of disapproval by parents will tip this. Some MPs will only speak out about cuts to education if they receive significant representation from those with the power to re-elect them (or not). I strongly recommend enlisting a parent or two who have expressed concern to you to spread the word about firing off an email to their local MP.

Let's raise the volume of protests! Children's immediate futures are at stake
