Future of school meeting

Thank you everyone for making our meeting last Friday such a positive and uplifting experience. It was very well attended (13 out of 17 families represented) and a number of very specific actions have come of this:

- 1) Wrap around care in school is an absolute priority. I am ambitiously targeting February after half term as a start date and will keep you all updated with progress.
- 2) Social Media should be used more to promote school activities. Thanks to Marie Louise Raeburn, the school's Facebook page is already active (please do 'like us') and plans are afoot to join Instagram and Twitter.
- 3) Parents at the meeting unanimously agreed that they should pay more to cover the full cost of a school dinner. Dinners in our school (as in common practice) have been heavily subsidized through our budget. As a consequence of the meeting, the cost of a meal will rise from 27th February 2017 to a cost of £2.60 per child.
- 4) The committee of The Friends of The School agreed with all those present that it was now appropriate that proceeds of school fundraising be directed to support the school budget. A meeting with Friends and governors will take place next week aimed at rewording the constitution of Friends and putting the practicalities of this in place.

Since the meeting, I've made direct contact with all 17 schools listed as having 35 pupils or fewer on roll in the county, with a view to arranging a conference of very small schools later in the year. I've had a very positive response to this and I know that sharing good practice with those in similar situations can only be extremely beneficial for all concerned. I look forward to keeping all the school community updated with the progress we make towards alleviating our financial situation and will arrange future meetings in due course which I trust will be well attended.
