Survey of Asby Common

Easy Weaving After School Club

A message from Debra Esterhuizen

Dear parents, I will be working with the children next term in after school club doing an exciting weaving project. We will begin with simple friendship bracelets working up to bookmarks, memory weaves (using old favourite clothing) teddy bear bedding etc and finally a communal large piece to hang in school. Friends have kindly agreed to the purchase of several wooden looms for the children to use and once I've taught them how to use them they will be able to use themselves in their free play both inside and outside at their own leisure in school for the rest of their stay at Crosby.

We will use yarns (if you have any lying around please send in, even tiny amounts) and recycling old tee shirts cut up into strips - again please send in an old favourite tee shirt, shirt, sheet etc.

In my former years I was a developmental Psychologist and researched areas of fine motor skills along with attentional deficits. With our ever-increasing usage of digital equipment, the hands are being used in a totally different way which can lead to problems. It is vitally important that children of all ages practice fine motor movements and focussed attention which in turn create more neural pathways in the brain. There is plenty of evidence to show that creativity and fine motor skills enhance cognitive development and intelligence.

So in a fun and creative way I invite the children to join me with friendship bracelets and weaving after school beginning 25th February.
