Most of us feel privileged to live in Crosby Ravensworth Parish and are passionate about where we live. One of the most important ways of managing our own affairs is through the Parish Council.

The Parish council's logo is **Working for the Community** that community consists of the three villages of Crosby Ravensworth, Maulds Meaburn and Reagill.

The Parish Council is made up of seven members with various experience and skill sets.

At present the Parish council has two vacant seats, which can be filled by co-opting and one vacant seat which must be filled by an election. if you are over 18 and live in the parish you are eligible to put your names forward for the Parish council, ideally it's good to have representation for all three villages.

We are now a community where most people were born elsewhere; it is good to have a mix of age groups, longer standing residents who have good local knowledge and others with experience they can bring to the table of ideas that have worked elsewhere.

You don't have to commit yourself until the next election, give it a try for a year and if it's not for you at least you will have contributed.

You may be surprised by the various roles that the PC members cover.

Don't ignore it – It could just be the job for you!

March 1st....Boundary Mill, Colne, a favourite for shoppers. Top brands represented with lots of discounted goods for sale.

April 5th....Salts Mill, Saltaire, Shipley, Nr Bradford. Another visit to this interesting area with a village built by Titus Salt for his workers. The large Grade 2 listed mill building houses a David Hockney exhibition and numerous independent retail outlets, cafes and restaurants.

May 10th....Holehird Gardens, Windermere. A 10 acre garden managed by the Lakeland Horticultural Society with magnificent views to Lake Windermere and beyond. Entrance by donation.

The Benefits Office was sleek and modern. The staff sat like bank cashiers behind protective glass. As in banks documents could be passed through a drawer in the small counter. Conversation took place through a grill. Privacy and human contact were out of the question.

Towards one of these windows a small, neatly dressed man with a white stick made his hesitant but determined way. When he heard, "Yes?" from behind the glass he took an envelope from his jacket pocket.

"I received this letter asking me to come and see you."

"Yes, that's right," said the woman. She was in her thirties, smartly dressed in a way that matched the steel and glass décor of the office. Cool, impersonal and well-spoken.

"The letter asks me," said the man, who was in his late forties, "whether my circumstances have changed."

"Of course my circumstances have not changed. I'm blind."

"We send these letters to everyone at regular intervals," said the woman, bored already.

"Well, it's pretty stupid sending a letter to a blind man."

"Haven't you anyone to read your letters? Who helps you with your bills?" she challenged him.

"No one. Where would I find some one like that in this town?" The woman made no reply and the man warmed to his theme. "I've got no one to help me and I have had to come all the way in here to tell you I am still blind. It's bureaucracy gone mad."

"We have to check regularly." She did not add "for fraud," though it was implied.

"Did you not know that I was blind?"

"There are over 8000 recipient of benefits in this town alone."

"All blind are they?"

"I have not asked them."

"Perhaps you ought to. I'm telling you, I am blind. Couldn't you make a note of that fact on my file?"

"It would make no difference."

"I mean," said the man in exasperation, "when you are blind you are blind. The circumstance does not change. And you cannot read a letter."

The woman yawned audibly. "You should get someone to help if you feel like that."

"I've told you."

"Yes, yes." She had no sympathy for time-wasters. A queue was forming behind the blind man. "All we need to know are whether your circumstances have changed."

"Well, I'm telling you, they haven't."

"Fine," said the woman and made one last, patronising effort at being human. "That's all we need to know." She shoved a form through the opening. "Now if you will just write your name at the bottom where it says signature . . ."
