Hi everyone. I just wanted to let you know that I managed to complete my fundraising challenge of walking/cycling 150 miles throughout the month of May, raising money through sponsorship for FND Hope UK. In September, when all the works on Smardale Gill Viaduct and the Lime Kilns beyond are complete we, courtesy of Westmorland Dales and Cumbria Wildlife Trust, are cohosting a wonderful event. There will be an art installation of 20 sound sculptures on top of the 90' high viaduct. Aeolian sound sculptures constantly evolve and change as the wind's movement and intensity varies over time, creating an immersive and everchanging soundscape that is responsive to the natural environment and provides a magical, unique sensory experience for those who interact with it. Created by Cumbrian artist Dan Fox, director of Sound Intervention based in Ulverston.



Simultaneously we will be showcasing artist Jill Brown's glorious voiles which will also be displayed during the event celebrating the line, the area & its heritage. They look particularly emotive blowing in the wind.

'Our Common Heritage' Exhibition

Appleby Tourist Information Centre 20th June to 17th September 2023

A Westmorland Dales exhibition inspired by oral histories with commoners and representatives of the farming community. The commons are an intrinsic part of our farming heritage and have underpinned the farming economy for centuries. The history of the Westmorland Commons links to the evolution of grazing animals in the area, the rise and fall of specialised breeding stock, droving and agistment, and the labour of tenant farmers working the common from small family farms for hundreds of years. The exhibition will summarise the results of our research into the history of the common land across the Westmorland Dales area, focusing on a range of oral history interviews we have undertaken with commoners and representatives of the farming community. Singing Viaduct Celebration

An Aeolian Sound Experience and Heritage Celebration on Smardale Gill Viaduct.

Friday 1st September to Sunday 3rd from 10am until 4pm each day.

A free Accessible walk through an installation of 20 sound sculptures on top of the 90' high viaduct. Aeolian sound sculptures constantly evolve and change as the wind's movement and intensity varies over time, creating an immersive and ever-changing soundscape that is responsive to the natural environment and provides a magical, unique sensory experience for those who interact with it. Created by Cumbrian artist Dan Fox, director of Sound Intervention based in Ulverston. It's an easy, flat, surfaced gravel path, wheelchair/pushchair accessible surface from the car park at Smardale to Newbiggin-on-Lune, with ramps at both ends. Reporting a Problem about Roads & Verges

Westmorland and Furness Council is responsible for the maintenance of roads and highway verges. Members of the public can report a fault easily online and add photos via the Westmorland and Furness council's website.

www.westmorlandandfurness.gov.uk/parking-streets-and-transport/streets-roads-and-pavements

An advantage of logging the fault via the online service is that people can provide their email address and receive automatic progress updates direct to their inbox.

The Highways team will then assess the fault and where possible repair it or as a minimum make it safe in line with the council's agreed standards.

You can report a problem with:

- potholes and road damage
- drains, gullies and flooding
- trees, hedges, weeds and grass
- bollards
- manhole covers, gully grates and kerbs
- road signs and markings
- pedestrian crossings, traffic signals and street lights
- road structures such as bridges and subways
- road debris and obstructions
- winter maintenance

You can also report a problem to Westmorland and Furness Council by phone.

Reporting Public Footpath & Bridleway Issues

Footpath and bridleway issues in our parish which are in the Yorkshire Dales National Park should be reported to their rangers. To report broken stiles, gates or signs, bridges etc, contact the ranger Tom using <u>tom.hickey@yorkshiredales.org.uk</u>

For issues like obstructions (gates tied or locked, stiles blocked etc), misleading signs, or to ask about larger access projects, contact Area Ranger Calum using <u>calum.stott@yorkshiredales.org.uk</u>

Footpath and Bridleway issues in our parish, but outside the National Park should be reported to <u>countryside.access@cumbria.gov.uk</u>
