Most of us feel privileged to live in Crosby Ravensworth Parish and are passionate about where we live. One of the most important ways of managing our own affairs is through the Parish Council.

The Parish Council's logo is **Working for the Community**, that community consists of the three villages of Crosby Ravensworth, Maulds Meaburn and Reagill.

The Parish Council is made up of seven members with various experience and skill sets.

At present the Parish Council has two vacant seats, which can be filled by co-opting and one vacant seat which must be filled by an election.

if you are over 18 and live in the parish you are eligible to put your names forward for the Parish Council, ideally it's good to have representation for all three villages.

We are now a community where most people were born elsewhere;

it is good to have a mix of age groups, longer standing residents who have good local knowledge and others with experience they can bring to the table of ideas that have worked elsewhere.

You don't have to commit yourself until the next election, give it a try for a year and if it's not for you at least you will have contributed.

You may be surprised by the various roles that the PC members cover.

Don't ignore it – It could just be the job for you!

A Look in the Past

Following on from our previous delves into the book 'Some Westmorland Villages', published in 1957 by members of the Women's Institute throughout the county, a little bit of an update.

The book obviously gave a glimpse into not just the past as it was in 1957, but also what those members of the Crosby Ravensworth WI knew of the history of our group of villages.

However, it threw up the odd question, such as, where is 'Liquorice Hill', who was the lady who had provided the drawings used in the book and a few other questions besides.

One of those questions was relating to this passage:

"Not so attractively named as some roads, but interesting in its implications, is Corpse Road, a track almost lost sight of now, but evidently at one time it led from Brackenslack by fields to Meaburn and then to Crosby church.

It was the custom for a funeral coming this way **to stop in <u>Meaburn</u>**, **by the <u>cross</u> there** whilst the mourners, with heads uncovered, sang a hymn before finishing the journey to the church and cemetery."

My question was if anyone knew anything about this cross, but needless to say noone ever got back to me!

But sometimes the answer is right under your nose or indeed, hidden in plain sight!

NEWS FROM CROSBY RAVENSWORTH C OF E SCHOOL

Well there are signs of spring what with the lighter evenings; the school planters at the entrance doors refilled with brightly coloured primroses and the bulbs popping up through the grass in the school grounds.

Love was also in the air, last month with our first ever school's Valentines' disco organized by the Friends of School and with the support of CR Village Hall Committee. The children LOVED it!

The children continue to enjoy a wide range of activities alongside their usual lessons. We were very proud last month to be the first school in Cumbria, to host a full day's visit from 'Mobius Loop Media'. If driving past, you may have seen a dark coloured lorry parked in front of the gates, but this was no ordinary lorry. It was a mobile state of the art studio enabling media production and education to be brought to our doorstep.... yes, here in Crosby Ravensworth. With virtual headsets on, the children were soon experiencing 360 degree virtual worlds, exploring outer space, deep oceans and safari grasslands. The Herons class even recorded their own Tudor drum and bass mashup, and then got to experiment with cutting edge sampling and looping technology to produce their own track, along with a professionally shot video to go with it! Comments from the children included "this was the best surprise", "this was the best day of school ever...ever". There are some great photos and videos on our facebook page-please take a look. The children's faces say it all....they definitely enjoyed the experience. On 6th March we celebrate World Book Day. The children (and staff too) are coming to school dressed up as a character from their favourite book and the Heron Class is joining the lunch club at the Butchers' Arms for a special guiz. Also, first thing, parents and grandparents can come in to school too and take part in the book swap and read with their child. So it's going to be a fun day.

The Herons have a fun action packed morning of animal adaptation and climate change fighting innovation planned for 12th, when we link in with the NFU live online farming Day.

The older children in years 5 and 6 are also looking forward to their residential trip to Liverpool for three days, alongside children from Asby Endowed School. The three days will soon go quick what with all the activities planned.

We also need to tell you about our next 'Pop in and Play' session which is on Monday 24th March. All children currently not in school or pre-school, from birth up to 5 years are welcome to join us from 9.30am until 10.30am for fun and games. Please phone on 01931 715265 to let us know if you'd like to come. Parents must accompany children. Please do pass on the message to anyone who you think might also like to know. This session gives you the opportunity to visit our fantastic school and meet the staff and pupils, whilst taking advantage of our terrific early years provision and your little ones can enjoy fun filled activities.

March 1st....Boundary Mill, Colne, a favourite for shoppers. Top brands represented with lots of discounted goods for sale.

April 5th....Salts Mill, Saltaire, Shipley, Nr Bradford. Another visit to this interesting area with a village built by Titus Salt for his workers. The large Grade 2 listed mill building houses a David Hockney exhibition and numerous independent retail outlets, cafes and restaurants.

May 10th....Holehird Gardens, Windermere. A 10 acre garden managed by the Lakeland Horticultural Society with magnificent views to Lake Windermere and beyond. Entrance by donation.

June 7th....Abbotsford, the home of Sir Walter Scott. Situated on the banks of the river Tweed and set in magnificent formal gardens. A self guided house tour will be arranged.

July 5th....A visit to Haworth, the hillside home of the Bronte family. Visit the Parsonage that echoes with the legacy of its famed sisters and walk the steep cobbled streets of the village.

August 2nd....A visit to Dumfries in the south west area of Scotland. Walk along the river at The Sands or visit the many shops in the town. Coffee en route will be taken at Powfoot a small village near Annan on the Solway coast.
