CROSBY RAVENSWORTH SHOWS 150th YEAR

Crosby Ravensworth show was first started in 1856 as a flower show, this was the first village show in Westmorland. By 1875 the show had grown to be a full blown "floral and Horticultural Society" with vegetables and flowers displayed in large marquees. In later years poultry classes were introduced along with root and corn crops.

After the war years the show was revived in 1948 when horses, cattle, sheep and horticulture were the main classes.

The year 2002 saw the vintage section introduced which has been very popular.

Over the last few years, although very well supported with entries, our show has struggled for committee members and helpers. As it stands at present we do not have a secretary. If anyone fancies a low paid job, this would be very helpful.

If anyone is interested in keeping the show going, there will be a public meeting in Crosby Village Hall on the 4th May at 7.30.

Please note that for some visits there will be an entrance charge payable as well as the bus fare. All trips this year will be subject to the latest Government guidance regarding Covid 19 and may be cancelled or changed at short notice. If social distancing still has to be maintained then only 10 passengers will be able to travel on the day so prior booking is essential.

5 March.....Boundary Mill Colne. One of the U.K's largest retail mill store.




