Update on Crosby Ravensworth Play Area.

On Friday October 21^{st} we learned we had secured a £10,000 grant from the National lottery, we have now secured the grand total of £19,000, all monies will be deposited into a specific PC bank account .

The £19,000 is made up of £3,000 from Cumbria community foundation, from two different funding bodies, £2,000 from Holehird Trust fund and £1,000 from The Westmorland Family Fund.

£2,000 from the Parish council

£1,000 from Crosby Ravensworth relief in Need Charity

£3,000 from fund raising events and the turnover of donated goods at the donation station. Although too many to mention by name we take this opportunity to thank you for all you have done to contribute, be it through a personal donation, baking, holding a raffle or going the extra mile to upcycle goods to sell on. Clearing of the overgrown rockery has also taken place.

The refurbishment group held their first scoping meeting in October 21 to explore the level of interest, this was followed in January with a structured meeting where officers were elected..

A coffee morning followed as a consultation exercise, the completed questionnaires provided evidence for the grant funders.

The aspirations the group held of a complete refurbishment were toned down to two phases due to the cost, an agreement was reached with EDC, who on providing replacement parts for the existing equipment at no cost to the refurbishment group, the agreement reached was not to replace those pieces of equipment for 5 years..

The quote for phase one of the refurbishment is £35,570 82 this includes removal of and replacing pieces of equipment, levelling the site, realigning the curbs, rebuilding the wall and a new gate. There is always the nagging concern, with the cost of raw materials increasing on a daily basis the quotes will spiral before we secure our next grants. Therefore fund raising will continue in the village shelter.

We have 4 grants live at present

I'm sure you will agree that securing more than half the predicted cost in ten months is a sterling effort, by both the community and the steering group, Thankyou once again to the community for all your support.








DID YOU KNOW....?

Either call in at the house or go to the box.



LYVENNET COOKBOOK

Pheasant Casserole

6 pheasant breasts

3 rashers of bacon chopped

I large onion

2 cloves garlic

1 red pepper chopped

1 green pepper chopped

2 & a half pints chicken stock

2 handfuls of spinach

Glug of white wine

1 red chilli

Half a cup of red lentils

Tablespoon tomato puree

2 large bay leaves

Method

- 1. Melt 2 tablespoons of olive oil & a good knob of butter in a large pan, fry the onion & garlic until transparent.
- 2. Add the chopped bacon & pheasant breast until browned either side.
- 3. Place all other ingredients including the above in a casserole dish & cook at 150c for 1 hour .

Stir a few times to help develop the flavour.

'Sleeping Giants' in Orton

Miscreations Theatre brought their Wilding Theatre Project of workshops, performance and a 'Dreaming Giant' to Orton this September thanks to support from the Westmorland Dales Landscape Partnership Scheme (funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund) and funding from Arts Council England. The Wilding Theatre Project delighted local school children with their intelligent and playful investigation into our relationship with the natural world, gently educating them about how the preservation of the planet and all its inhabitants: animal, insect, plant and human contribute to a rich and rewarding community for us all. It is well worth a visit to Orton playing field!

Nicola Estill, Community Engagement Officer with the Westmorland Dales Landscape Partnership Scheme said, "It has been wonderful to be able to provide support for such an innovative and engaging season of summer events in the Westmorland Dales.

"The theatre group made us all think about how we can develop a healthy and sustainable relationship with the natural world and made it loads of fun for the children, parents and teachers!" Children from Orton C of E Primary, Asby Endowed Primary and Crosby Ravensworth C of E Primary Schools took part in theatre workshops, making cob to build a living earth 'Dreaming Giant' sculpture and enjoyed a 'Wilding' theatre performance at the end of a busy summer of activities.

Emma Pomfret, Head Teacher, Orton C of E Primary School said, "We loved the Wilding theatre project! There has been so much positive talk of what everyone experienced and that performance was just out of this world.

"The children have been talking about going to see the giant again on the way to and from school. We feel really privileged to have been given such an amazing experience and also to have an 'Earth Giant' on our school field. We are very lucky."

This collaborative project delivered residencies over the summer in schools and communities across the region including Allendale, Orton, Otterburn, Hexham, and Barnard Castle.

The 'Earth Giants' will become a place to revisit at different times of the year to see how they are becoming 'wilded'. As these giants evolve and grow, footage from each season will be shared on the Miscreations website.
