#### NEWS FROM CROSBY RAVENSWORTH C OF E SCHOOL

Welcome to the new school year and the autumn term, the children (and staff) having returned revitalised after their summer break. There have been some changes within school, keenly spotted by the children! Extensive work was carried out over the summer to both improve and maintain the facilities we currently offer, thanks to the much appreciated financial support from the Crosby Ravensworth United Schools Foundation and Friends of the School. We are extremely grateful to the Trustees.

Playground markings have been added to inspire the children to explore new ways of playing actively on the school yard. The outdoor learning canopy outside class 1 has been refurbished to make it more hospitable for our younger children throughout the winter months. Extra storage and play resources have also been added. Both the outside and the majority of the inside of the building has been painted, there just being the main hall left to do which is planned for over the Christmas break. A number of new display boards have also been added around the school which will enable us to neatly display more of the children's work, which we know they love to do. LED lighting has been fitted throughout to improve the environment for the children, reduce our carbon footprint and of course reduce our energy bills. New shelving has been added to our storage area, allowing us to smarten up school and house our new topic boxes for our younger children.

This has been a massive undertaking and we're all extremely pleased with our makeover.

So what have the children been doing so far this term aside from their usual lessons......?

Towards the end of last month our children joined up with children from Asby Endowed school for a Wilding Theatre workshop with Miscreations followed by storyteller, Gav Cross putting on an evening show at C R village hall the next day. The children's' time together was spent helping to prepare for the show and provide some sounds. The children had to prowl and howl like wolves whilst hunting for natural objects to make music with. Then they were recorded using these items and also their voices to make a lullaby for the play. Next, they had to imagine they were passing through a tree and down into the earth. They went through a door and along a passage where some of them had stories of creatures they met on

their journey. Finally, the children were able to volunteer to make some cob for a giant's head to be used as part of the stage for the play. This involved them having to mix soil, sand, water and straw which was then slapped onto a frame. It was an amazing experience to be part of.

Then on the sporting front, it's been a long time coming but both our teams made the semi-finals of an inter-school tournament. The successes came at the Morland Shield. The netballers reached the semis of their tournament, having won against Warcop and a draw against Morland. After a nail-biting shoot-off that followed a goalless draw with Bolton sadly we were knocked out. The footballers went a step further, reaching a thrilling final against Warcop which was eventually lost by a single goal with the last kick of the match. The team had previously beaten Long Marton in the semi-final and had wins against Culgaith and Morland and a draw with Warcop in the early rounds. We are so proud of their achievements and to us they are our sporting heroes. Well done.

So we are now in to October and class 1 are looking forward to participating in 'Action Ants', promoting fun through physical play, at Shap. We then have our Harvest Festival in Church and with Bonfire Night not too far away, PCSO Dakin is going to talk to Class 2 about staying safe. The whole school are also looking forward to visiting the Sunbeams Music Centre to attend a community concert with the A4 Brass Quartet. This will be a wonderful opportunity for the children to experience the sounds of live classical music.

What with 'Breakfast Club' available from 8am every morning and our afterschool clubs, this means that our school is able to provide wrap around care from 8am to 5pm. This term's afterschool clubs include Autumn craft, Acrobatics, Rassamatazz, Art and Sport.



Pat was well known in Orton for her involvement with community initiatives, and her friends Joe Kirkbride and David Halliday had planned to hold a tractor run to honour her, since her death three years ago, but were unable to do so before now because of the pundemic.
