

You will be sent to patients with chest pain, cardiac arrest, breathing difficulties, loss of consciousness, but will not be sent to accidents or children. Crosby Ravensworth Community First Responders have been responding for over 20 years. We are a friendly,welcoming group who meet regularly to maintain our skills and undergo training and assessment from North West Ambulance Service. We aim to attend call-outs in our area and are contacted by NWAS by pager or mobile phone. We are actively seeking new members and would be delighted if you could join us. 'End of Term report' winter 2021/22



The

Well Field at Woodfoot

Our third year of tree and hedge planting began with the Well Field on Woodfoot pictured above. The deal with the farmer was that we could plant it with trees if we fixed the boundary walls. So we started in September with a team of volunteer novice wallers and with the help of Keith Golding and the YDNPA apprentices we completed both walling and planting before Christmas.

After Christmas our time was largely spent hedging on Woodfoot, Midtown Farm and Flass with just short of a mile of hedging planted. The hedge below, at Woodfoot, was 340m long and became known as the 'Great Wall' for the way it snaked across the landscape.

During the planting season 24 different volunteers expended nearly 900 manhours.

Again we had great support from the YDNPA apprentices who made and installed the gate on the Wall Field, assisted with planting the trees there as well as a major part of the planting at Flass.

Work completed this year is as follows:-

Burnt Croft 175m Hedging and 10 trees

Flass 264m Hedging, 20 Trees

Haber 3 Tree cages 3 Trees

Low Row 4 Tree crates, 16 Trees

Midtown Farm 596m Hedging and 30 Trees

MMVG 11 Tree cages, 11 Trees

CR School project 24m Hedging, 10 Trees

Woodfoot (Jenkinson) 530m Hedging, 14 Tree crates, 256 Trees

Woodfoot (Maughan) 4 Tree crates, 416 Trees

None of this work could have been achieved without funding and so we must thank all our funders:-

DEFRA 'Farming in Protected Landscapes' programme (FIPL) administered by YDNPA

FIPL was our biggest funder in 2021/22. Circa £14k of funding enabled us to plant 1200 metres of hedging and 90 trees

Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust (YDMT)

YDMT provided circa £4.8k. This enabled planting of 190 metres of hedging and 600 trees

YDNPA

A £2000 grant from YDNPA enabled the building of 12 tree crates and 14 tree cages in which we planted 26 2yo trees and 36 subsidiary trees

Friends of the Lake District

A grant to Crosby Ravensworth School enabled us to fence off a small area of Low Row farm adjacent to the school to create a new wildlife/ Environmental area. The children planted 24m of hedging and ten different trees with supervision from tree group volunteers. Thanks must go to the Dent family for agreeing to this project.

Regular Contributors

We have a number of regular contributors who have donated over £600 this year

Woodland Trust

Last but not least our thanks to the Woodland Trust without whose support none of this would have been possible. Again the Woodland Trust have supplied the majority of our trees and hedging plants.

For thousands of years people and their animals have passed along routes through the Westmorland Dales and they have unsurprisingly left their mark both physically and culturally on the landscape around them. celebrating these heritage routes at the Old Courthouse, Shap from 3rd Sept – 2nd October.

An update on the play area refurbishment progress.

Thank you to everyone for your kind donations of money, goods and books, the income of over £2,500 has resulted from those donations and sales, the Parish council have pledged £2,000 and the Relief in Need Charities £1,000.

The community support has given the group the confidence to move forward to apply for grants. We are constantly getting the quotes for equipment updated as the costs of raw materials increase on a daily basis. Therefore our original ambitious plans have been scaled back to replace the equipment in three stages.

Last week we met with an officer from EDC who verified we have all the information in place, by the end of August a number of match funding grant applications will be submitted simultaneously.

If the grant applications are successful we intend to start the first phase in spring of next year, with the replacement of two pieces of equipment.

We will still need to rely on the support from the community to reach our increasing target, and plan to keep the donation station open for the unforeseen future.

I'm sure you'll agree it's disappointing to have hazard tape around favourite pieces of equipment especially during the school holidays, Eden District Council are providing the replacement parts for the equipment we have agreed to keep. We will continue to keep the pressure on to get a fully functional and upgraded play area at the earliest opportunity.
