VistaVeg is small veg-grower's co-operative producing responsibly-grown fruit and vegetables which it sells directly to 400 families through its veg box scheme. We also lead education work in local schools, host visits from community groups, deliver Grow Your Own Veg courses and undertake project management work around food-growing locally.

As part of Open Farm Sunday, we're welcoming visitors to our polytunnels and packing shed to see what we're growing this season. Alongside other Cumbrian farmers and growers VistaVeg is part of <a href="Home Grown Here">Home Grown Here</a> - an initiative to grow more fruit and vegetables in Cumbria. Find out how we're all working together to build a better, more sustainable food system for Cumbria.

A self-guided walk to our field and orchard between Crosby Ravensworth & Maulds Meaburn is also available.
