Welcome to our first Friday bulletin of the new school year. We hope you all had an enjoyable summer and are ready for the action–packed term ahead.

# HM Queen Elizabeth II

We are deeply saddened by the death of Her Majesty the Queen. Her dedication to public service has been an inspiration to children and adults alike over the past 70 years. She will be hugely missed by the nation, including all those in the world of education. We have fond memories of celebrating jubilees together with children during her reign. Through her dignity and unswerving sense of duty, the Queen has set an extraordinary example to us all, and she has been a reassuring presence through many turbulent times. We pay tribute to her in our thoughts and prayers today.

# Attendance in School

Last year our school attendance figures were 3% lower than the national attendance target and consequently attracted some attention. When compared to previous years, this can be seen as a blip, but it's something we must strive to improve upon.

2021/22 - 92.6% 2020/21 - 96.5% 2019/20 - 95.2%

There were some mitigating factors, in particular the effect of COVID related absences, however we are aware that our figures compared poorly against neighbouring schools and there has been a growth in unauthorised holidays taken out of term time. Term dates can be <u>found here</u>.

Students with 99% or better attendance each term now receive a special attendance certificate to reward their achievement. Those who maintain this throughout the year will receive a special prize. Good attendance is prioritised on our school development plan where progress to date and next steps are documented. Governors discussed and challenged the school's approach (summer 2022) and will continue their focus throughout 2022/23.

## Summer works

We're sure you'll all have noticed that extensive work has gone into improvement and maintenance of the school over the summer months:

- Playground markings have been added to inspire the children to explore new ways of playing actively on the school yard.
- The outdoor learning canopy outside class 1 has been refurbished to make it more hospitable for our younger children throughout the winter months. Extra storage and play resources have been added courtesy of the Friends of the School.
- Painting of the exterior of the school has been completed and most of the interior has been completed, leaving just the hall to be covered during the Christmas break.
- A number of new display boards have been added around the school to allow us to neatly display more of the children's work.

- LED lighting has been fitted throughout the school to improve the environment for the children, and reduce our carbon footprint and reduce our energy bills.
- New shelving has been added to our storage area, allowing us to smarten up the school and house our new continuous provision topic boxes for our younger children.

This has been a massive undertaking and we're extremely grateful to the Crosby Ravensworth United Schools Foundation for their considerable financial support helping us to fund these improvements to our school.

## **Music Lessons**

Recorder sessions will recommence next week and will run every Thursday for all Y4, Y5 and Y6 pupils. Over the course of their three years of sessions, each of our pupils is able to leave our school with an understanding of musical notation – something I am particularly passionate about. The sessions are given by our expert peripatetic teacher, Carolyn Fyfe. We seek a voluntary contribution of £10 per term towards the cost of this, which we would appreciate in the next couple of weeks. This represents excellent value for parents, being considerably less than the norm in other schools.


