## **Pupil premium strategy outcomes**

This details the impact that our pupil premium activity had on pupils in the 2023 to 2024 academic year.

## Comprehensive Tracking and Assessment:

- In a small school setting, we recognize that data alone doesn't fully capture the impact of our efforts.
- o Alongside statutory data, we conducted internal assessments termly.
- Staff meetings were held to track progress and address the needs and learning gaps of all pupils.

### Focused Support for Pupil Premium Pupils:

- Pupil premium children were clearly identified and highlighted in our tracking system.
- High-quality teaching and timely small group support were prioritized to address areas of need.
- 100% of pupil premium pupils received intervention or small group support as needed.
- Senior leaders ensured pupil premium pupils were prioritized when assigning intervention groups, even in borderline cases.

## Targeted Learning Sessions:

 Dedicated sessions were timetabled to address difficulties or misconceptions in learning, with pupil premium pupils given priority.

#### Personalized Support for Families:

- The small school setting allowed us to build strong relationships with families and handle situations with sensitivity.
- We supported pupil premium families through:
  - Additional meetings (e.g., to address attendance)
  - Subsidizing trips and residentials
  - Providing uniforms
  - Permanent loan of family laptop

### • Enriching Experiences for All Pupils:

- The school offers a variety of enriching activities, including:
  - Pony riding
  - Paddle-boarding on Derwent Water
  - Visits to places of worship in Glasgow (focused on world religions)
  - Exploring York's museums
- 100% of pupil premium pupils participated in the residential trip to Hawes End at a subsidized cost.
