### 3. Staff Training

- All staff, including governors, receive Prevent and safeguarding training annually.
- DSL undertakes enhanced Prevent training.
- Staff are briefed on updates to local risks or relevant policies.

#### 4. Curriculum and British Values

- British Values: Democracy, rule of law, individual liberty, mutual respect, and tolerance are embedded through the curriculum.

- PSHE/RE Lessons: Focus on understanding diversity, challenging stereotypes, and promoting respect for different faiths and beliefs.

- Whole-School Activities: Assemblies and events (e.g., Remembrance Day or inter-school collaborations) reflect values of inclusion and community.

#### 5. Reporting and Monitoring

- Safeguarding Reporting: Staff are trained to recognize and report concerns to the DSL using established safeguarding processes.

- IT Monitoring: Regular checks on internet usage via school-provided systems.

- Governance Oversight: Governors review Prevent policies and their implementation during annual safeguarding reviews.
