Personal, Social and Emotional Development

<u>Mathematics</u>

Children will begin to look at numbers beyond 10 and embed a deepened understanding of 0—10. They will identify, construct and count to 20 and beyond using the number pattern. We will make amounts larger and smaller by adding and taking away.

Communication and Language

Children will have opportunities to confidently talk in small groups and full classes. They will hold a back and forth conversation with an adult and peers and use vocabulary from stories they have heard.
